

# Wooldridge joins chamber staff

The ability of the Dublin Chamber of Commerce to “hustle and bustle” has just been magnified with the addition of a second part-time employee.

Nancy Wooldridge, a 10-year resident of Dublin, joined the chamber staff last week. She will work with executive director Karen Wright, focusing on event coordination and office management.

Wright will reduce her chamber hours to accept the part-time position as executive director of the Economic Development Corporation which shares office space with the chamber. The chamber and EDC will remain independent of each other, but Wright will serve as part-time executive director of both.

Mrs. Wooldridge came to Dublin in 1999 from Colleyville where she worked as project manager for Choice Homes, Inc. Combined with positions in California and Oklahoma, she has 30 years experience in residential and commercial construction.

“Nancy’s background is awesome,” Wright commented. “When I heard her say she could multi-task and stay calm under pressure, I said ‘sign her up.’ She has outstanding organizational skills and is very much a people-person.”

She immediately began work on the chamber’s two major upcoming events -- the membership banquet on Feb. 25 and St. Patrick’s Festival events, which kick off on March 17.

She serves as secretary of the Dublin Senior Citizens, treasurer of the Women’s Thursday Club, board member of Keep Dublin Beautiful and finance chair for the First United Methodist Church.
